As a school we are committed to working with you as parents/guardians to encourage attendance and punctuality of our pupils. We believe that ensuring a high attendance rate gives the best start possible to the lives of our young people.

We have set an attendance target of 96% for all pupils. There is a clear correlation between attendance and the standards that pupils achieve.

If a pupil has an attendance of 95% they will have missed two weeks of education in a school year, which also has an affect on their ability to learn, their welfare and their feeling of belonging.


